## Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan

Thurlaston Parish Council has joined with a number of adjoining Parishes with a view to producing a Neighbourhood Plan (the Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan). This will advise how the future development of Thurlaston and the surrounding area will evolve up to 2029.

Over recent years there has been a process of consultation with all local residents and stakeholders. This process has not been without it's difficulties and delays, but we are now approaching the stage where we will be asking all residents in the village to let us have their views on what is proposed.

During late autumn/early winter you will receive a separate Newsletter which summarises the main issues and options for all the Fosse Villages. We would encourage every member of your household to read the Newsletter and let us have your views. Details of how to respond will be included within the Newsletter.

### What is a neighbourhood plan?

Neighbourhood planning is a way for communities to contribute to decisions on the future of the places where they live and work. A Neighbourhood Plan will set out a vision for an area and planning policies for use and development of land. The Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan will form part of the statutory planning framework for the area and it will be used to decide future planning applications.



## Thurlaston vision

### for 2029:

- Individual character of Thurlaston is maintained
- Impact of traffic is reduced
- Important open areas are protected
- New homes meet local housing needs
- Linear housing development only along existing roads

### **Local Traffic**

We are concerned about the new development at Lubbesthorpe and the impact it will have upon the local road network and in particular increased traffic through Thurlaston. We would like Leicestershire County Council Highways to conduct an investigation into the impact of this additional traffic. This investigation to pay close attention to additional traffic schemes along the A47, Forest Road and through our Village.

#### **D-DAY MEMORIAL**

The trees associated with the D-Day memorial have suffered constant failures over the years.

The Parish Council have therefore decided to move the stone to a better place on the recreation ground and in November we will be planting a new tree. The tree was given to the Parish Council at the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations and has been grown on since.

On Friday November 11<sup>th</sup> (Armistice Day) there will be a small ceremony to dedicate the planting of a new tree.

Members of the Parish Council and Primary School will meet at 10.45am for a small service with songs and poems, then the planting of the tree by Mr Eric Slack, followed by a 2minutes silence at 11am.

All are welcome to attend.

### QUEEN ELIZABETH II 90<sup>TH</sup> CELEBRATION

As part of Queen Elizabeth II 90<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration, Thurlaston Parish Council, with members of the Parish, in May, combined to host an afternoon tea party with music from the era provided by Croft Silver band.

# VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR – HEARTLINK COMMITTEE



The Parish Council have set up a 'Heart link Committee' specifically for the purpose of fundraising for a village defibrillator. Fundraising started at the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebrations where a terrific £800 was raised. Since this event, individuals and village community groups have continued to contribute and we have just heard that we have been successful in receiving £1,000 from Blaby District Council and a further £500 from the Carnival Committee. We have also had pledges from the Thurlaston Players and Party in the Park. We are very grateful for all contributions and help from the village residents serving on the Heartlink Committee.

A target of £3,000 has been set to purchase the equipment, house it in a special cabinet on the outside of the village hall, provide training and ongoing maintenance for the first 3 years.

To get us to the required amount we are planning a further 2 Christmas Fund Raisers so please come and join us at the following:

**1st December 2016 at 6.30pm** 'Christmas tree Light Switch on' (top of Tyers Close).

**20th December 2016** 'Santa's Carols around the village'

Santa and his troop will be singing carols and travelling the village, starting at All Saint Close at 6.30pm, to Nursery Close, to Tyers Close, to Enderby Road, to Holt Crescent. To Moat Close. All singers welcome. Finishing at the Village Hall at approx. 8pm for mince pies and mulled wine.

ALL are invited to come along for an opportunity to view the equipment, find out more about the defibrillator and sign up for future training.

### PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL AWARDS

Blaby District Council has recently introduced new powers to combat the problem, but it is up to all dog owners to take responsibility.

Could we urge and remind dog owners to carefully clean up after their dogs. It is important in all areas of the village, but especially around and within the recreation ground, where children play.

Dog bins are provided and it costs the Parish Council a lot of money to have them maintained and emptied regularly.

At this time of year, with the dark nights we would urge dog owners to use them.
