

Thurlaston Village Hall

The great news is that the Village Hall is fully COVID secure and 'open for business'.

During the summer, whilst the Hall has been closed owing to the COVID-19 restrictions, a significant amount of work has been undertaken to ensure that the Hall remains a first-class amenity for village residents and other users.

The main hall has been completely redecorated in a theme of 'blues'. To further improve the main hall new curtains have also been put up on stage and at all the windows. Additionally, the main hall floor has been sanded and repolished – you can see your face in it!! These actions along with the kitchen extension and refurbishment make the hall a great venue for all types of meetings or events.

Whilst the hall is open COVID-19 restrictions mean that for the time being a maximum capacity of 30 people in the hall has been imposed. Other COVID measures include:

- Adherence to the 'rule of six' criteria.
- Face coverings must be worn in the hall (with some limited exceptions).
- A one-way system for entrance & exit is in operation (all signposted).
- Upon entry to the hall all people should check their temperature using the thermometer in the lobby.
- Hand Sanitiser stations are at strategic points throughout the hall.
- A COVID-19 waiting area has been created in the cloakroom in the event anyone falls ill whilst in the hall.

A NEW WOOD FOR THURLASTON



Firstly, a massive thank you to everyone who turned out to plant the trees on an absolutely dreadful day back in February.

The weather this year has not been exactly conducive in encouraging plant growth. The spring deluge followed by a period of drought has meant that not all of the trees have taken and we are currently looking at how many will need to be replaced. It is planned to undertake this work before the year end. Thanks are due to Bob Whelband who was responsible for initiating the planting, and his band of willing volunteers, who have been taking care of the wood during the year.

Once the planting had been undertaken, the wood had to be given a name.

With the help of the Headteacher of Thurlaston Primary School, Gavin Beetham, the 'Name the Wood' competition was launched and all pupils of the school were asked for their choice of name and the reason why.

The response was commendable, with very creative choices from all ages, however two entries stood out and they were declared the competition winners, each received a prize of a book on trees and a gift voucher:

Theo Porter suggested The 'Daniel Newton Wood' - in Daniel's memory. Hopefully it may put a smile on his Mum and Dad's face and let them know we haven't forgotten him.

Marshall Tate Meakins suggested 'Daniel Newton Wood' - I would like to name the wood after Daniel Newton, the boy that died last year in May, from the village. It would be nice for his Mum and Dad to visit.

With the full consent of Daniel's parents, the 'Daniel Newton Wood' was founded.

We plan to hold an official naming ceremony on 9th April 2021 when a plaque will be unveiled. More details nearer the date.
