After the September parish council meeting, it was agreed that Cllr Philip Marshall would take on the re-planting of Daniel Newton wood to ensure the sustainability of such a valued community area.

update.

The work carried out so far to date by Phil is as follows:

The site, has been flail mowed, inspecting any of trees which were still alive, in which these were mowed around, then dug up, and re-planted, along the outer edge of the site, in which some have taken, and some have died. The ones which have died, will be replaced.

The site, has then been ploughed over, then cultivated down, ready to plant.

Phil has also been very fortunate, that trees, of all kinds have been donated for this project under Phil's management, along with tree stakes, and tree guards, from a local landscaping business, and local people, around his business in the Rugby area, however, the trees cannot be collected until the leaves have dropped, which to date, is just starting to happen.

Amongst the trees to be planted will be:

English Oak, Hazel, Beech, Horse Chestnut, Sycamore and Pussy willow

After the trees have been planted, the whole site will be covered in a thick layer of wood chip/bark chippings, donated by a local recycling company, to suppress, any further weeds/grass problems.

A big thank you must go to Paul at the garden centre for donating, a lot of ground covering plants, which will be planted between the trees, to give colour in the spring, and summer months.

Another thank you, is to Andy Bell, farm manager at Yennards farm, for allowing access to and from the site, whenever it has been required.

The final 'thank you' is from Thurlaston Parish Council and the residents of Thurlaston to Cllr Phil Marshall for offering and continuing to support the development and success of Daniel Newton Wood.
