

#### What is FoxConnect?

FoxConnect is funded by the Government's Rural Mobility Fund, which aims to trial on-demand bus services in rural and suburban areas. The objectives of the DRT service, as set out by the Department for Transport (DfT) are to:

- Improve access to employment, education, healthcare and other services.
- Enable greater social inclusion and reduce isolation.
- Provide a public transport offer that attracts a diverse customer base.
- Support the Government's commitments to tackling air pollution and reducing carbon emissions by reducing reliance on private vehicles

FoxConnect is a partnership project between Woods Coaches, National Express, Liftango and Leicestershire County Council

The new demand responsive service allows customers to book journeys via an app making it a convenient and flexible way to travel around South West Leicestershire.

# Where does the service go and what areas does it cover?

Key destination points for work, leisure or onward travel have been identified as part of the service development and will be included as pick-up and dropoff points to encourage frequent use. These include:

- Fosse Park
- Next HQ
- Carlton Park
- Enderby Park & Ride
- Narborough Train Station
- Hinckley Train Station
- Magna Park

Serving multiple villages in the area, the new service will give customers the opportunity to choose exactly where they are picked up and dropped off from making it quick, convenient and flexible.

#### Areas covered by FoxConnect include:

Thurlaston, Huncote, Littlethorpe, Whetstone, Croft, Cosby, Stoney Stanton, Sutton in the Elms, Primethorpe, Sapcote, Broughton Astley, Aston Flamville, Sharnford, Frolesworth, Leire, Dunton Bassett and Narborough.

# **Dog Fouling**

Escalating complaints have been received relating to dog fouling.

# When out walking in the Parish please remember:-

- Pick up all dog waste, even in a field. It matters. Dog faeces are full of disease causing bacteria and parasites. This can cause cattle to abort. It is an offence not to pick up after your dog. Fixed penalty notices can be issued. Fines can be up to £100.
- Carry spare poo bags. It is an offence not to do so and a fixed penalty notice can be issued.
- Remember to please pick up dog waste within the Recreation Ground
- Don't abandon collected waste in plastic bags on your walk. Put them in the bins provided or take it home.
- Stick to designated footpaths, don't wander. Treat other people's property with respect.
- If you are not sure where the footpaths are, do your homework and research before setting off. Please do not wander or roam at will.

We have a lovely Parish and are lucky to have countryside on our doorsteps. Please help to keep it this way. **Thank you.**
