LOCAL ISSUES

DOG FOULING

The Parish Council have received numerous complaints about dog fouling within the village, including the recreation ground, church yard, pavements and front gardens, with the situation worse than we have ever known, especially over the recent winter and spring.

We realise the vast majority of owners are responsible and pick up after their dogs however we are aware that a minority of owners are not and are causing considerable problems not just unsightly 'mess' but also the risk to public health. In the churchyard all dogs should be kept on a lead and the gate should be 'closed' on entering and exiting.

On the recreation ground, dogs, their owners and all other users have happily co-existed for years, however the Parish Council have a clear priority to maintain the recreation ground as a 'play area' for all ages, especially children.

We have renewed the dog notices from Blaby District and have requested the Dog Warden to increase patrols.

We do not want to take such drastic measures such as only permitting dogs on leads on the recreation ground or looking at a complete ban if the situation continues and does not improve quickly.

We urge responsible dog owners to continue their recognised and appreciated care to pick up after their dogs.

We also urge the reporting of any irresponsible dog owners directly to Blaby District Council, which can be done in confidence and it will enable the Dog Warden to take the appropriate action.

FLY TIPPING AND LITTER PICKING

There have been several instances of fly tipping along Earl Shilton Lane and other roads during the las few months. It is very disappointing to see our countryside being spoilt by this mindless vandalism, however good to note that a call to

Blaby District Council to report the issue usually results in a quick and thorough cleaning up of the unsightly mess.

There have been some instances where the litter has been deposited further away from the roadside verge into spinneys or fields along the road. When this happens, it becomes the responsibility of the landowner to deal with the problem.

We are lucky that the majority of our roadside verges are relatively free of litter, you may not be aware that this is often the result of a small band of 'locals' who regularly combine a pleasant country walk with a spot of litter picking! We would like to express our thanks to this unassuming group of people, whose thoughtful actions help to make our village and its surroundings a pleasant place to live.

THURLASTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Appointment of New Parish Councillor

Full Council formally appointed and welcomed Mrs Roni Tinsley as a Member of Thurlaston Parish Council at the Full Council meeting held, Thursday 2nd November 2017, following the resignation of Mrs Katrina Judson in August due to relocating out of the area.

Precept 2018-2019

The Thurlaston parish section of the council tax rose to $\pm 13,500$.

The outcome of this is that for 2018/19 the Parish Council Tax Rate will be £47.86, compared with £44.14 for 2017/18 – an increase of £3.72 per annum (8.43%).

Recreation Ground

As part of our ongoing maintenance program, a recent inspection of the recreation ground wall has confirmed that further maintenance work will be required. The work has been planned over a period of one week in the Autumn.

Following all the media reports, changes to Data Protection rules and regulations have been introduced and become effective from 25th May 2018.
